Annual report for the year ending August 31, 2023

Scouting Waterloo Region held its first Troop Summer Camp since prior to the COVID-19 pandemic. The camp was at Kelso Conservation Area on the Niagara Escarpment (see cover photo). Every day we went canoeing and mountain biking on their large trail network. We visited the high ropes course, climbing tower, and archery range. We cooked pizzas in reflector ovens and had campfires and wide games. 12 youth and 3 adults participated.

We returned to long-distance cycling with a Troop weekend camp and ride from Laurel Creek Conservation Area to Pinehurst Lake Conservation Area, a ride of 50 km.

New initiatives this year included a Troop crosscountry ski day with the Waterloo Region Nordic Sports Club and an all-section water polo evening in collaboration with the KW Kraken Water Polo Club.

Regular meetings for the Troop section were generally at Laurel Creek Conservation Area every two weeks on Sunday afternoons for four hours. Activities included canoeing, hiking, Klondike Derby, sledding, snowshoeing, first aid, learning how to change car tires, campfires, and biking on local trails and at The Hydrocut mountain biking area. The Troop had five weekend camps plus the summer camp.

Regular meetings for the Bevy and Pack were also every two weeks on Sunday afternoons for 1.5 hours. Activities included canoeing, hiking, map reading, sledding, snowshoeing, making jelly from fruit they picked, biking on local trails, and campfires. There was a winter day camp and an overnight spring camp. The association is funded mostly by membership fees. A large donation allowed the purchase of a solid supply of paddles and PFDs to enable our canoeing program.

There has been more membership churn than usual. In 2021/22, many new members joined seeking entirely-outdoor activities. Due to a decline in concern about the COVID safety of indoor activities, many of these left Scouting to return to their previous activities in 2022/23.
